Mr. VanZytveld's Opus The JCS Music Program

When Jenison Christian School students transfer to Unity Christian, they comprise 16% of the entire student body. Interestingly, nearly 30% of Unity Christian's Choral Ensembles are made up of former JCS students. "This is a testimony to the superior work of Mr. David VanZytveld (current JCS Music Teacher)", says current UC Music Director, Ashton Foreman. Membership in two of the five ensembles is by audition-only. Applicants must demonstrate mastery level skills in vocal technique, musicianship, and sight reading. In Ashton's senior year at Unity, her ensemble was Choir of the Year for the state of Michigan in 2005.

Student-turned-Director has now led the Ensemble for ten years and has received 1 ratings at District and State for eight years now. Those eight years have been highlighted with a 2018 trip to Michigan Youth Arts Festival for the girls in 2018 and then the boys went for the first time in school history in 2019.

Likewise, Brian Knot leads the Concert and Symphonic Bands at Unity, of which 20% are former JCS students. "David is a consummate musician who never accepts anything less than excellence. JCS students consistently have a mastery of the fundamentals of music with a careful attention to detail." describes Brian Knot.

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
Spiritual Emphasis Week 2021 Have You Filled Your Bucket?

Brian is equally impressed with the challenging music style and selections that David's bands play and even articulates that in all of Unity's musical offerings, JCS musicians are prominently featured.

During Spiritual Emphasis Week at JCS, members of Unity's Praise Band came to lead the worship in the Opening Chapel. Seven of the nine were former JCS students and used their talents vocally and instrumentally. One of those returning praise band members is also the leading role in Unity's upcoming fall musical "Anastasia", Anna

Riemersma. She praises her former music teacher in this way, "Going into high school I felt so prepared. I'm so thankful because it gave me confidence

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trying out for the top choir and musicals". The fall musical comprises 28% of JCS alumni. She continues, "I've always appreciated the opportunities he gave us to participate in chapels as a Praise Team, it encouraged me to get more involved in chapels at Unity. I can't wait to continue praising God with the talents Mr. VanZytveld has helped me develop."

David encourages budding musicians at school, but also helms a family of well-trained musicians at home. David and his wife Betsy have three sons who, while students at Unity, completed the AP Music Theory class, taught by Brian Knot, and he notes the characteristics of well-trained musical excellence was especially true in Andrew, Calvin and William. Betsy admits, "We moved to Michigan for the middle school position at JCS. We never imagined that he would love it so much, stay long term, and enjoy expanding in the younger direction, adding [music education to] grades Pre-K-3rd! We are grateful for all of these wonderful years, both for us and our three sons - all JCS graduates." David accepted the JCS position and started fall of 1998.

David's impact at JCS is that he teaches all third graders to play the guitar while fourth graders learn to read music with recorders. Fifth and sixth graders get their first official introduction in the band and learn woodwinds, brass, and percussion according to their ability. Concert and Jazz Band, Concert and Honors Choir, and Praise Team are available to all seventh and eighth graders that show proficiencies and skills and continue as skilled musicians. Honors Choir was invited on three separate occasions to perform at

the Michigan Music Conference in 2002, 2007 and 2013. This is the highest honor given to middle school choirs in the Michigan School Vocal Music Association. For the selection process, schools submit choir recordings and a panel selects choirs to perform at the MMC. Principal Joe Oosterheert comments "David is here every school day morning working with different groups of middle school students from 7:30-8:00am [before school starts for the day]. He faithfully schedules all chapels and leads the praise and worship chapels for Pre-K-4th, and 5th-8th grade chapels."

Playwright Arthur Miller, when interviewed by filmmaker Ken Burns, once described performing arts in this way, "Do something that will last and be beautiful." Ashton Foreman sums it up perfectly, "Mr. VanZytveld's students learn skills that will last them the rest of their lives and influence our churches and Christian communities long after their time with him." Thank you Mr. VanZytveld for your leading influence in the arts here at JCS. It has lasted and is beautiful. The image of Christ is evident in your teaching!
